

## Appendix: Script and Pictures used in Experiment 2

### False-belief Condition

The false-belief condition in Experiment 1 was identical except that the pictures featured different women.

<b>Introduction-1</b>		<p>“This is a story about a girl named Emily.”</p> <p>“There’s Emily! Do you see Emily?”</p> <p>(Pause 3 s)</p> <p>“Emily has a friend named Sarah.”</p>

<b>Setup-5</b>	 	<p>“See? She’s outside playing with her frisbee.”</p> <p>(Pause 3 s)</p> <p>“Emily wakes up and she’s hungry! She looks</p>
<b>Test trial</b>	 	<p>“See? Emily is looking for her apple.”</p> <p>(Pause 3 s)</p> <p>“Emily is looking for her apple.”</p> <p>(Pause 3 s)</p>

## Knowledge Condition

The knowledge condition was identical to the false-belief condition except for the script used in setup-3, setup-4, and setup-5 and the picture used in setup-4.
